Our NEW Nursery

The Nursery is currently part of a split class provision with Reception pupils. The provision is based on a stage not age approach with the curriculum and learning and teaching opportunities meeting the needs of all individuals whatever stage they are at.

The Nursery ethos is one of a calm, welcoming environment with a home-from-home feel. With access to a teaching kitchen, quiet sensory room, and bespoke outdoor learning spaces, this building provides our Nursery children the opportunity to thrive and flourish.

Nursery School Times

Nursery children start school over a number of days during the first few weeks of the term. School state nursery will run from 9am – 11:30am or 1 – 3.30 pm each day. *We will provide further information closer to your child's start date.*

Collection and Drop-off

Contact the school if you make arrangements for someone else to collect your child. Please make sure you are on time to collect your child, however if you are going to be unavoidably late, please telephone as soon as possible.

Drinks and Snack

Every day the children will have milk; this is provided free of charge. If your child does not drink milk, they are able to use their water bottle which can be refilled throughout the session. Please provide a daily bottle of water and one healthy snack for your child to have at break. These should be labelled clearly with your child's name in a suitable container.

If your child has any dietary requirements or allergies, please inform the school office and Nursery staff.

WrapAround Care - Little Haven Pentyrch

We are now able to offer our families WrapAround Care following their state Nursery session in school through Little Haven Pentyrch. The provision is housed within the school and is available from 9.00 am – 1:00 pm or 11.30 am – 3.30 / 5.30 pm as required. 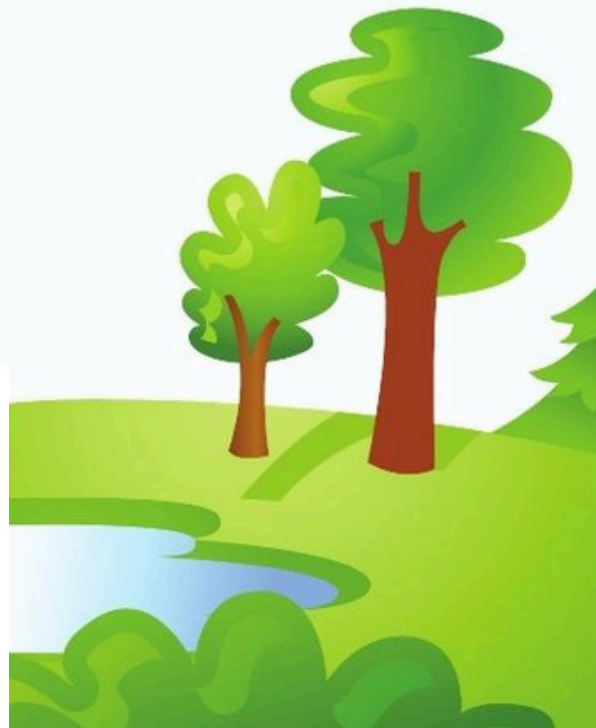


Your child's first day

You will be contacted regarding your child's first day at school. On this day please arrive at the Nursery entrance at your allocated time. You will be greeted by a member of staff and directed to your child's class entry point.

Emergency arrangements

It is important that we have full details of how to contact you in case of an emergency. We will ask you to complete a set of admission forms.



School Clothing

Nursery children can choose to wear school uniform. They could wear it in part or as a complete set. Uniform is available to purchase from Safewear UK

We encourage children to develop independence and self help skills so it is important that care is taken when choosing the clothes children wear to nursery. Careful consideration has been given to ensuring the school uniform can be easily managed and worn. Please ensure that every item of clothing is clearly labelled with your child's name.

Children will take part in a 'Health and Wellbeing Day' for which they will need to come to school dressed ready for a morning / afternoon in the outdoors in i.e. House colour t-shirt and shorts or jogging bottoms with daps or trainers.



Outside provision is offered every day, so please make sure your child has clothing appropriate for the weather. We ask children to bring a pair of wellies to school, labelled with your child's name. These will remain in school for daily use.



Health and Illness

In the case of absence, please telephone the Office Manager, Miss Reed who can then inform the Nursery team.

For the health and well-being of children and staff, please keep your child at home if they are unwell. Children must not come to Nursery if they are suffering from common childhood illnesses such as a high temperature, sickness and / or diarrhoea or chicken pox.

Please note, children with sickness/diarrhoea must be well for 48 hours before they return to school. Please contact the school office for further information regarding time required away from school with specific illnesses.

If your child needs an Epi pen, Asthma medication, or any other prescribed medication, please make sure the school is aware and that we have the medication required in school and you have filled in the relevant paperwork available from the office. We are unable to administer unprescribed medication such as CalPol and can only give antibiotics if they need to be taken 4 times daily.

If your child becomes unwell at school, we will contact you so that they can be collected from school. **Completion of the admission form providing emergency contact numbers is imperative.** Please notify us should any contact numbers change as we require up to date information.

Asthma

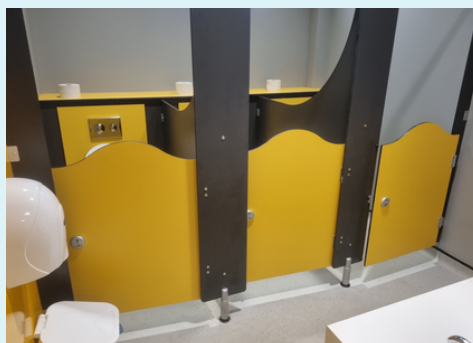
Ask your GP for a spare pump so that it can be kept in school. The school's medication form must be completed and signed giving us details on dosage and use of pumps.

Allergies

Please inform the school if your child has any allergies and provide appropriate prescribed medication should your child need it.

The New Curriculum

Our Foundation Phase curriculum is a careful balance of adult-led focused activities and pupil directed play, which ensure that the learning of our youngest pupils is both enjoyable and rewarding.

The six 'Areas of Learning' are:

- Expressive Arts;
- Health and Well-being;
- Humanities;
- Languages, Literacy and Communication;
- Mathematics and Numeracy;
- Science and Technology.



Children will also develop:

- their understanding of Religious Education;
- their understanding of diversity and the importance of respecting differences;
- experiences and skills for careers and the work place;
- their understanding of local, national and international contexts;
- appropriate relationships education.



Health and Wellbeing

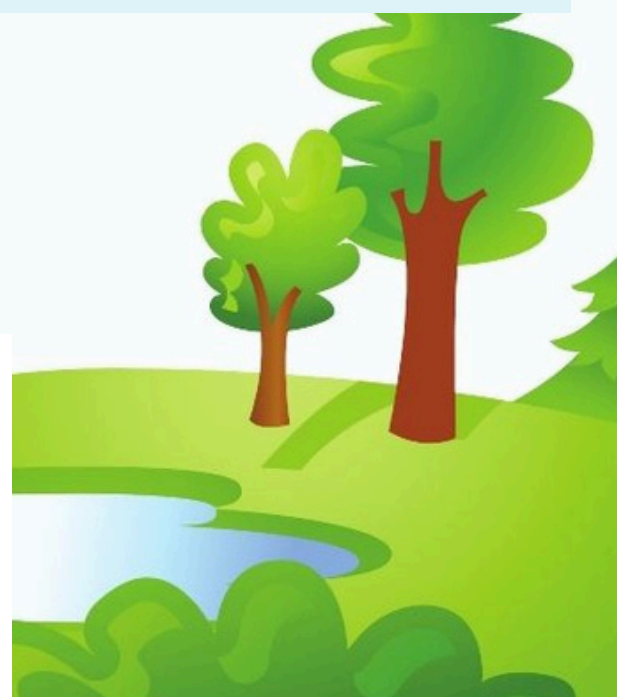
...is about looking after their physical and mental health including emotional well-being. They'll learn about healthy eating and how to make good decisions, deal with influences and develop healthy relationships.

Developing children's personal and social skills and well-being is at the heart of our teaching in Pentyrch Primary School. By providing a caring and safe environment, children learn how to interact with adults and other children. They learn how to co-operate and to share.



We support the children to develop their abilities to understand and control their emotions. Developing children's aspirations, self-esteem and motivation, is a key focus throughout their school years.

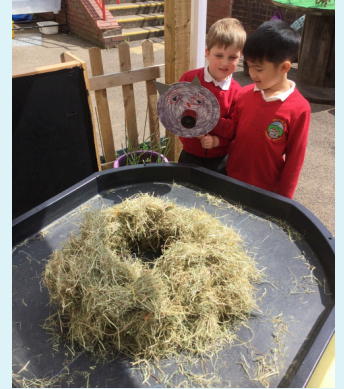
We strive to promote a healthy lifestyle and a love of exercise. Through physical activity, children develop fine and gross motor skills. They learn to manipulate a range of equipment safely and with increasing control whilst developing muscular strength, mobility and an awareness of themselves.



Language, Literacy and Communication

Your child will learn about languages. They'll understand and use Welsh, English and other Languages. they'll study and create literature, and communicate in spoken, written or visual ways. This could include poetry, drama and film.

In Nursery, we aim to provide a rich language experience allowing the children to express themselves through role play, circle time, story time, rhymes and songs. These experiences will form a sound basis for early reading and writing skills.



We aim to develop all aspects of languages so that the children become good speakers and in time good readers and writers. We provide clear structured activities to challenge the children. These allow them to develop language and literacy skills at their own pace and with confidence. We follow a programme of phonics teaching in the early stages of Nursery that will be at the core of developing language and literacy skills.

The Welsh language is delivered through activities, song and incidental Welsh. The children are provided with opportunities to experience and enjoy using Welsh in their everyday activities.



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Mathematics and Numeracy

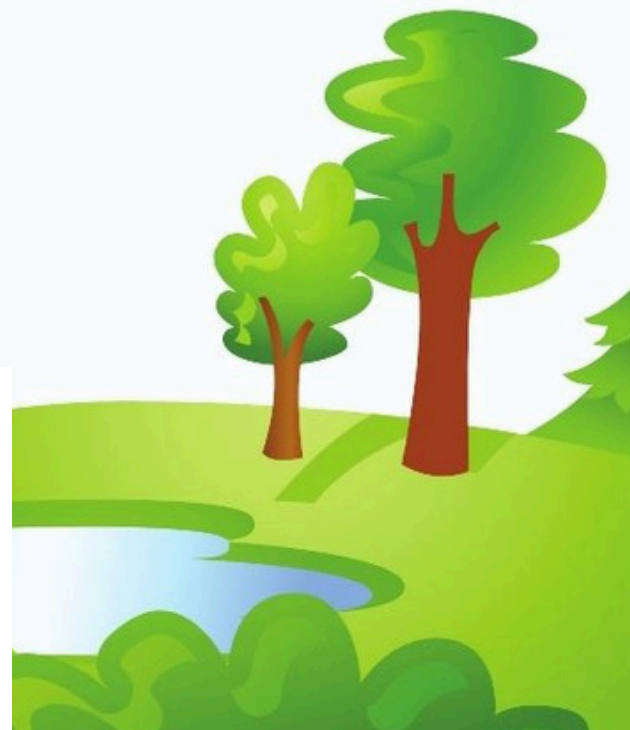
Your child will develop their understanding of numbers and use symbols in Maths. They'll explore shapes and measurement and learn about statistics and probability.

Mathematics within the Foundation Phase is based upon providing activities, both in the classroom and the outdoor learning environment. These will allow the children to learn through hands-on, real life experiences.

These activities enable children to develop cognitive thinking whilst manipulating all kinds of equipment.



Through such playful opportunities, the children are involved in their own learning experiences. Children will develop mathematical language through participation in number songs and rhymes. They learn how to co-operate with others and begin to experience problem solving and decision making. Through focused activities the children then begin to develop a more formal understanding of Maths concepts such as addition and subtraction.



Expressive Arts

Your child will explore art, dance, drama, film and digital media and music to develop their creative, artistic and performance skills.

Throughout the Foundation Phase an important emphasis is placed upon creative development. Children will have the opportunities to observe, and to develop their creative and expressive skills. These make an important contribution to their overall progress.

Creativity provides children with opportunities to manipulate different textures, colours and mediums, to respond to and enjoy rhythm and music and create movement in dance, whilst engaging in the pure enjoyment of exploration.



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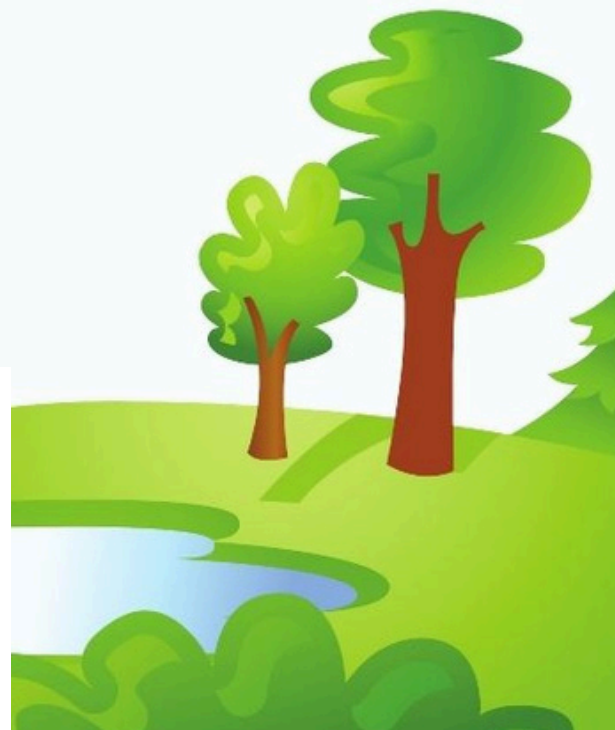
Humanities

Your child will learn about the world, society and events in the past and present. They'll explore the challenges and opportunities that face us, and what ethical action we can take to safeguard the world and its people in the future.

Children are naturally inquisitive about the world in which they live. They enjoy exploring, matching, sequencing and experimenting. Our role is to provide such opportunities for children to discover and understand the world around them.



Well-structured activities allow the child to develop a basic understanding of the locality, nature, ourselves and our health. Our contexts for learning take a thematic approach allowing the children to develop a clear understanding of today's world.



Science and Technology

Your child will learn about biology, chemistry, physics, computer science and design and technology. They'll learn about design and engineering, living things, matter, forces and energy, and how computers work.

Children learn best when they are provided with practical experiences in order to engage with the world around them.

They will be actively encouraged to show curiosity and question how things work when

constructing and deconstructing objects. As independence is something we value highly as our school, we facilitate

opportunities for children to use simple tools, materials and equipment when engaging in collaborative projects. As society is mostly shaped by technology, we begin to understand how computers work by following a sequence of instructions to control a device.



As young scientists, we actively promote the importance of trial and error. Through play-based activities, children will explore the effects that forces have on themselves and objects, forming the building blocks to understanding more complex theories.

How can you help your child?

- Talk to your child positively about nursery school and how much they will enjoy being here.
- Encourage your child to use the toilet independently. Teach your child to flush the toilet and wash their hands with soap.
- Label **all** coats, clothing and shoes with your child's name. The school cannot accept responsibility for lost items of clothing.
- Teach your child to dress and undress independently and put on shoes and socks.
- Tell us about any allergies or needs your child may have.
- Things that happen at home , may affect your child in school. Please tell us if there is a reason why your child is unsettled so that we can understand any possible change in behaviour.
- Keep your child at home if they are unwell.
- Give your child the opportunity to use crayons, pencils, glue, scissors etc at home.
- Outdoor play is an important part of your child's development. Please ensure your child has warm clothes in the colder months and is well protected from the sun in the summer.
